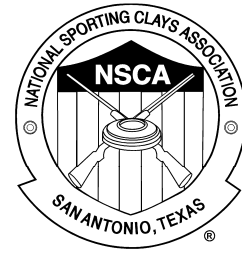


CRITERIA

Team USA English Sporting Selection Shoots



1. The selection shoot will be awarded to a qualified club that can provide the necessary experience and, at a minimum, the following facilities needed to host the shoot:
 - a) At least a 200 target main event of **two** courses with a minimum of **12** stations each to be shot over **at least two** days (Saturday, Sunday).
 - b) Main Event will be squadded.
 - c) 2-3 shooting games are DESIRABLE but Not Required
 - d) Adequate facilities (i.e., clubhouse, restrooms, catering, space for vendors)
 - e) Acceptable hotels and restaurants nearby.
 - f) Adequate parking space on or very near venue and shuttle transport if required.
 - g) Name of the target setters
 - h) Name of the shoot
2. The dates of the shoot must be published at least 6 months prior to the shoot.
3. The club will provide practice fields **at least** one day before the main event.
4. All competitors may register in advance for this event with a \$100 deposit.
5. The shoot shall use experienced referees, preferably at least 18 years of age and, ideally, experienced shooters not shooting in the Main event.
6. Options for the shoot will be determined by the host club. All payouts and awards will be mailed out within 15 days of shoot completion. All participants will receive a mailer showing all winnings and payout information.
7. Shootoffs shall be held the same day the event is completed. The shoot off procedures will be determined by the host club. Adequate lighting is required to hold shootoffs.
8. The host club is encouraged to host a social function.
9. All selection shoot events (including small gauge) will be REGISTERED and NSCA daily fees charged. State daily fees will also be collected if required by an approved state association at time shoot is approved.
10. If any additional fees are to be added to the published entry fee, such as state sales taxes, the amounts must be disclosed in the application and all programs, shooter forms and advertisements if fees are quoted in those ads.
11. Ranges desiring to be considered for a selection shoot will submit an application to the International Committee by September 15th the year before the shoot. The International Committee will vote on the selection by September 20th and forward it's decision to the Executive

Council for approval.

12. **To be qualified**, the range must be in good standing with the NSCA at the time of the application and must retain that standing through the year the shoot is held. The qualified range must have demonstrated a high level of contribution to the sport and at a minimum must:

- Have been in good standing for a minimum of two target years prior to application.
- Have conducted a State, Zone, or Major Shoot (200+ shooters) under the current management.
