

A special election was held, to fill the vacancy left in Colorado, by Gary Lane who recently passed away.

Rule I-C-1-d on page 9 of the 2010 NSCA Rule Book – National Delegate Vacancies – Any National Delegate vacancies occurring among the various states or provinces, territories, or geographic subdivisions recognized by the association, shall be filled for the balance of the unexpired term. A person from the same geographic subdivision receiving the next highest number of votes in the same election as the vacant Delegate, will be eligible, as long as that number of votes is equal to five (5) members of the current state membership. If that person signifies that he or she does not choose to serve the position shall be declared vacant and an election shall be held within 45 days to fill the vacancy.

According to this rule there were no other persons available from the 2009 elections that had 5 votes, to fill the position; however, the current delegates and the Colorado State Association made recommendations to NSCA Headquarters of people who volunteered to be replacements. There were three people who said they would accept the position, if elected. Those three names were placed on the ballot, which was sent to all current NSCA members, as of December 31, 2010, in Colorado. The names on the ballot were Bruce Jones, Matt Lane and Bill Noyce. There were 571 ballots mailed out. 106 ballots were returned to NSCA Headquarters by the Deadline date of June 27, 2011.

The election results are as follows:

Bruce Jones – 52 votes

Matt Lane – 21 votes

Bill Noyce – 33 votes

Bruce Jones was elected to fill the vacancy as Colorado Delegate for the remainder of the 2010-2011 term of office.
